

### Web references in proposals, dissertations and theses

The FHDC declared war against web references. These things are not trustworthy and may not stay on the web for long. The references must be limited to preferably not more than **two**. At no stage must their information be used as **main** evidence but only as **supporting** evidence.

Web references may not be included in the Reference List. They must be indicated by superscripts in the text and given as a foot note on the page used. Superscripts will start at 1 then 2 then 3

#### Example:

In the text: The road is dangerous because it is wet and slippery<sup>1</sup>. See footnote below.

The student must revisit the web reference not more than one week before submitting his “draft” manuscript to the FHDC. Use that date “as accessed on” and make a print of the first page which must accompany the draft document.
