1. POLICY STATEMENT

It is the policy of the Tshwane University of Technology (TUT) -


to encourage the participation of staff and postgraduate students in conferences

2. DEFINITIONS

- If they are meant for the dissemination of original research and new developments in specific discipline, subdiscipline or field of study;
- if peer-reviewed articles from the proceedings have been accepted for publication;
- if the proceedings have an ISBN number; and
- if the target audience of the proceedings are specialists in the relevant field

3.2.2 Funding for conference participation will include the following:

- Conference registration fee
- Travel costs to and from the conference (an economy class ticket will be funded).
- Travel insurance
- Cost of visa(s). No passport fees will be funded
- Accommodation of economic standard
- Subsistence will be paid at the approved TUT rate.

3.3 Postgraduate students

should have attended at least one conference before they graduate. Postgraduate students, depending on merit and the availability of funding. especially on doctoral level, may be considered for participation in conferences abroad members to national conferences.
